TEST	PURPOSE	REACTION	ADD'T'L NOTES										
HUMAN INTERACTION: The helper picks up the puppy (not affectionate just normally) and walks away to a secluded area (about 20 ft.) places puppy on the ground – no talking. Helper walks away about 10 ft.	DEGREE OF SOCIAL ATTRACTION CONFIDENCE OR DEPENDENT	A.. PUPPY FOLLOWS IMMEDIATELY WILL MATURE INTO A VERY WILLING WORKER. B.. Pup stays to check things out-then realizing he is alone-runs to helper-WILL BE EASY TO SOCIALIZE AND HAS A GOOD HUMAN DEPENDENCE. C.. Pup looks, sees helper leave, and acts like the "heck with you" and proceeds to check out area he is in-will always be CONFIDENT AND SELF-INDULGENT.											
SUBMISSION/DOMINANCE: The helper now kneels down on the ground, claps his hands, and calls "puppy, puppy...." Part 2: Now place puppy gently on his back, with tester's hand on chest, and start counting slowly 1 (1000), 2 (1000), 3 (1000) etc. until you reach to 10. <i>Be sure to release immediately when puppy starts to struggle.</i>	Part 1 is explained in items A-C; (part 2 will tell us the "DEGREE" of submission we can expect from this puppy as he matures.) 1-3 = Independent & strong willed! Possibly difficult to train/ needs firm control from "alpha" leader. 4-6 = Very good, but will have a "mind of his/her own" at various times (owner will need to "outsmart" this one!) 7-10 = Very submissive, will not take any real "intuitive" without owners consent. Will need conformance guidance & confidence "boosts" P.S. Most 10's end up very easy going, "laid back" (lazy) and at times almost "dull"	A.. Pup pays attention quickly-sees helper and runs up happily-CONFIDENT, SOCIABLE, PERFECT DOG. B.. If pup hears, sees helper, thinks about it and then slowly "slinks" toward her- the puppy will be SUBMISSIVE, OBEDIENT, BUT LACKS SOLID "HELLO WORLD" ATTITUDE A SHEPHERD SHOULD HAVE. C.. If pup hears and sees but ignores the call-he is displaying DOMINANCE & WILL BE DIFFICULT TO TRAIN. 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SOCIALABILITY: The tester now walks up to pup, kneels and pets the pup, talking softly.	Degree of Dominance & trainability	A.. Pup jumps all over the person, licking and playing-this puppy is HAPPY TO ACCEPT HUMAN COMPANIONSHIP AND WILL THRIVE ON PRAISE. B.. Pup prefers to chew on tester's hands, clothes, feet, whatever-is displaying DOMINANCE -TRYING TO TAKE CONTROL, AND WILL BE HARDER TO TRAIN. C.. Pup ignores the human gesture-He will be HARD & VERY DOMINANT-will not accept authority well.											
ELEVATION/FORGIVENESS: The helper stands up, picks up pup with one hand on either side of the belly, so all four feet are full of the ground-pup should like it is standing in air-hold this position to count of 5 and then place pup on ground by helper's feet and walks away slowly, encouraging pup to follow.	DEGREE OF ACCEPTING DOMINANCE WHILE IN A POSITION OF NO CONTROL.	A.. If pup holds very still while held up in their air and seems relaxed, then follows immediately when placed on ground-He WILL GROW INTO A GOOD, LOVING SUBMISSIVE ADULT & WILL BE VERY EASY TO WORK WITH. B.. If pup struggles when held up, yet still is willing to follow helper-He will be a BIT MORE DOMINANT-BUT EASY TO WORK WITH-USUALLY GREAT FOR SCHUTZHUND TRAINING-not happy with situation he can't control but willing to deal with it. C.. Pup that struggles, bites and fights is either SCARED to death OR VERY HARD AND DOMINANT-if he recovers quickly and tries to attack helper's feet-SUPER HARD-If he cowers and refuses to make friends-SCARED AND LACKS CONFIDENCE.											

SCHUTZHUND TEST

<p>PAIN THRESHOLD: Helper places pup in lap and with right hand places her thumb and index finger between puppy's toes and presses slowly, counting from 1-10 as she increases pressure 1 being very light pressure and 10 being very hard.</p>	<p>DEGREE OF SENSITIVITY TO PAIN</p> <p>1 2 3 4 5</p> <p>6 7 8 9 10</p>	<p>A If pup yelps before you reach #3-VERY SENSITIVE and will need VERY MILD training methods to bring it to its full potential.</p> <p>B.. If pup reacts violently between 4-7-CONFIDENT-MEDIUM PAIN sensitivity-can be easily trained with mild corrections although can take a harder one once in a while.</p> <p>C.. The pup that scores 8-10 has a very HIGH pain threshold and needs a FIRM handler-makes the best for most Schutzhund work.</p>	
<p>RETRIEVE DRIVE: The helper holds pup next to her and shows it the "toy", then throws the toy a few feet in front of her-2-3 is perfect.</p>	<p>DEGREE OF WILLINGNESS TO WORK WITH A HUMAN</p>	<p>A.. Pup runs out, grabs the toy and comes back when called-TERRIFIC-SNAP TO TRAIN-SHOW AND HE DOES.</p> <p>B.. Pup runs up, grabs toy then drops it-but willing to return-may have problems with retrieve in Schutzhund but a willing worker-will always try to please you.</p> <p>C.. Pup runs up, grabs toy, looks back and runs off to play-INDEPENDENT. If training too sever will rebel and balk every step of the way.</p>	
<p>GUNSHYNESS: Helper stands above the pup and clangs two pots together.</p>	<p>DEGREE OF SENSITIVITY TO LOUD NOISES.</p>	<p>A.. Pup that doesn't react to sound AND continues to play-VERY GUN-SURE.</p> <p>B.. Pup that "startles" for a second but quickly recovers and goes on playing-GUN-SURE and CONFIDENT.</p> <p>C.. Pup that yelps, cowers or tries to escape-GUNSHY, CAN'T DEAL WITH LOUD NOISES.</p>	
<p>FIGHTING DRIVE: TWO tests first helper takes can full of stones and rolls it past the pup, then take s towel or burlap sack and plays tug-o-war.</p>	<p>DEGREE OF INTELLIGENT RESPONSE TO STRANGE OBJECT</p>	<p>A.. Pup sees the can roll past but ignores it-probably does not play with rag too quickly-DOES NOT HAVE "KILLER INSTINCT" loves and trusts the world.</p> <p>B.. Pup runs up to can to investigate-GOOD INTEREST-will probably play with rag for awhile-BEST TO TRAIN FOR Schutzhund-will not likely be sleeve happy and will be more CONTROLLABLE.</p> <p>C.. Pup runs up to can-attacks it-HAS LOTS OF DRIVE-will grab the rag and tug and pull and growl and try to kill it-when you let go pup will run off with it-HAS TONS OF DRIVE GREAT FOR SCHUTZHUND-FIRM, HARD TRAINER.</p>	
<p>THE MAZE: Take pup to the obstacle course with four sides and one door the front board no higher than 18 inches, but the pup has to go over to the right side of it to find the door so he can get out-pup is placed in center of maze and helper stands back about 10 ft. and ENTHUSIASTICALLY calls here puppy, puppy and clapping hands.</p>	<p>DEGREE OF INTELLIGENT RESPONSE TO STRANGE ENVIRONMENT</p>	<p>A.. Pup looks around, realizes he is trapped and starts to cry-LACKS CONFIDENCE AND SELF-MOTIVATION will depend on his people to show him everything.</p> <p>B.. Pup starts to run around looking for a way out-HIGHLY INTELLIGENT WILL BE A THINKER AND DOER-if he finds door and gets out-EVEN BETTER-SUPER SMART.</p> <p>C.. Pup fights, struggles and tries to climb over the board in front-DEFINITELY CONFIDENT AND DETERMINED-prefers to use BRAWN OVER BRAIN.</p>	

The SAR Test

Test 1

Prey Drive Using age appropriate teaser, tester gets dog's attention and throws the teaser a short distance away. (Note: roll teaser with younger puppies.)

- EXC Puppy runs to teaser and immediately snatches up, perhaps shaking to "kill" it.
- OK Puppy runs to teaser and checks it out. May pick up toy if thrown repeatedly.
- IND Puppy doesn't run to teaser or shows no interest.

Test 2

Retrieve After puppy gets teaser, tester encourages puppy to bring back by jogging backwards and calling.

- EXC Immediately brings back and spits out toy for more play.
- OK Brings back but doesn't give up toy.
- OK Brings back but darts out of reach, wanting you to chase.
- IND Doesn't bring back.

Test 3

Hunt Drive (Persistence) Hide teaser under foot or in hands (just barely showing) and encourage puppy to find.

- EXC Digs, mouths, and whines for toy.
- OK Nudges and uses paws for toy.
- IND Tries halfheartedly or not at all.

Test 4

Tug Response Using towel, booda, or rag, tease puppy and allow to grab.

- EXC Immediately grabs and tugs vigorously.
- OK Grabs with repeated teasing and/or encouragement, let's go.
- IND Grabs only if repeatedly teased. Won't hold on.

Test 5 (P&S)

Possessiveness Tester lets go of tug while in puppy's mouth.

- EXC Shakes toy to "kill" it, tries to engage tester to play again.
- EXC Shakes toy to "kill" it, runs away with toy.
- OK Runs away with toy, drops soon after.
- IND Drops immediately.

Test 6

Follow (puppies 3 months & under)--Tester calls puppy and jogs backwards while clapping softly.

Recall (puppies over 3 months)--Helper restrains dog while tester jogs backwards and calls dog's name one time.

- EXC Runs to tester, ramming shoulder into tester's leg or jumping up.
- EXC Runs to tester and solicits affection.
- OK Jogs to tester, nudging or looking for attention.
- IND Jogs to tester & leaves, or doesn't come at all.

Test 7

Attention Span Using age appropriate teaser, get dog's attention and bring teaser to tester's face level. Use teaser sparingly to maintain eye/facial contact with puppy for 30 seconds.

- EXC Willingly looks at tester's face and toy for duration. Cocks head to listen.
- EXC Watches tester for duration, looking away briefly if background distractions interfere.
- OK Watches tester but needs to be re-engaged a few times.
- IND Easily distracted or unwilling to look at tester's face.
